Following the prayer, we'll invite you to write on the opposite side of your paper, something that helps you understand why the resurrection is good news (what messages of love, justice, and mercy speak to you?). Once you are done writing on your strip of paper, place it back in your egg. When we pass the peace at the end of the service, we invite you to continue passing whatever egg you have in your hand with the next person! Then take it home with you and carry the prayer and words of resurrection with you.
