



WAYS TO PRACTICE AT HOME

Living in community allows us to care for one another, share joys, and bear burdens. Try these actions to show care:

- Do something kind without expecting anything in return.
- Share encouraging words.
- Listen deeply to both words and feelings.
- Practice positive gossip by speaking kindly about others.

Brainstorm ways to help neighbors in need, such as after a fire, with a new baby, or assisting an elderly person. Identify community helpers and talk about what they do and the characteristics that they have as helpers.
