Local/Regional Mission

- **Detroit Hunger Mission** delivery of our all-church monthly food collection, twice yearly, to the Presbytery of Detroit, 17575 Hubbell and McNichols. Hunger Action Coordinator, Unah Matu-Ngare, also runs the special "Cereal for Summer" campaign which provides food for kids who rely on subsidized breakfasts and lunches during the school year.
- Friends Indeed Circles program, Ypsilanti financial and volunteers serving Tuesday PM dinners for participants that offer a "hand-up" and for those working to improve their lives.

- House By the Side of the Road financial and gently used donations of clothing and household items for FREE distribution to clients. This is a total volunteer run organization working with referrals from other agencies.
- S.O.S. (Students Offering Support) Community Services, 101 S. Huron St, Ypsilanti - Twice yearly delivery of food to this strong community service which operates one of the largest, most active food pantries in Washtenaw County. It is dedicated to preventing and ending family homelessness.

They work together to coordinate health, family counseling, the New Hope Community Center, mission education and the Just Trade Center. PW contributes financially and prayerfully.


BIBLE STUDIES & READING GROUPS

Presbyterian Women Celebration Giving

Since the Presbyterian Women are not a part of the church budget, funding comes as "second-mile giving" from the generosity of individual pledges and bequests, as well as donations from hosting memorial receptions. These financial gifts fulfill our \$4,250 yearly pledge to Presbyterian Women in the Presbytery of Detroit – 95% is forwarded on to the Presbytery of Detroit, to the Synod of the Covenant, and to PW in the PC(USA) for their missions. The Mission Pledge supports and funds every mission and ministry of PW.

Ingathering of Gifts

First Presbyterian PW partners with other churches and nonprofit agencies to provide specific items from baby diapers to adult needs. This past year we chose to "Ingather" new underwear for of all sizes for our local House By the Side of the Road. PW responded and delivered over \$550 value of clothing, gift cards, and money. This year we plan to also "Ingather" for our local House By the Side of the Road again, expanding our collection to underwear and pajamas for women and children from September through November. Monetary donations are also welcome.

The Birthday Offering

Since 1922, the Presbyterian Women's Birthday Offering has helped fund mission projects that improve lives around the world and here at home. Since its inception, the PW offering have contributed more than \$36 million to different projects. The 2024 recipients are: Advocates for Community Choice dba Bethel Hills in Marthasville, Missouri and Shawnee Presbyterian Church's Café Gingko in Louisville, Kentucky. The Thank Offering

Since 1888, Presbyterian women have joyfully expressed gratitude for God's blessing by sharing their blessing with those in need at home and around the world. This year, the Creative Ministries Offering Committee







of Presbyterian Women granted 8 requests for funding. Six of the projects serve people in the United States and two are international. In keeping with the Thank Offering bylaws, more than 40 percent of the selected projects are related to health ministries. All funds collected for the Thank offering are sent directly to PW-PC(USA).

Fellowship of the Least Coin

Fellowship of the Least Coin is a global, ecumenical prayer movement. This movement links prayer and "least coins" in a very significant way, as the least coin of each participant becomes a symbol of prayer for peace and reconciliation. Coins offered from around the world signal our oneness in our common quest for peace, justice and reconciliation. The offering of least coins is used for grants to special projects of evangelism, service, ecumenical solidarity, relief and awareness-building among women throughout the world.

Begun in 1956 by Shanti Solomon of India the importance of this prayer and least coin movement is just as relevant now as it was 64 years ago. Least Coin is collected at each PW meeting. All funds collected at First Pres for the Fellowship of the Least Coin are sent directly to PW -PC(USA).

FSIL Haiti School of Nursing

The Faculté des Sciences Infirmières de l'Université Episcopale d'Haïti (Faculty of Nursing Science of the Episcopal University of Haiti or FSIL) is the first four-year baccalaureate school of nursing in Haiti. Our own Dr. Ruth Barnard was instrumental in organizing this nursing school. FSIL opened in 2005 with the first graduation in 2009. As of 2022, thirteen classes have graduated, totaling 250 BSN's and 16 FNP's, and 13 joint FNP/Family Midwifery graduates, many of whom remain in Haiti. PW continues to support FSIL through the Haiti Foundation, Ann Arbor, in honor of Ruth and her extraordinary vision and work.

Christian Ministry Scholarships

Funds from Presbyterian Women participants and endowed gifts provide scholarships to those interested in educational opportunities in Christian Ministry. PW defines Christian Ministry as service to God and his people that improves or enhances the ability to spread Christian faith to others. Scholarships are available for any First Pres participant, member, staff or pastor who seeks to increase their knowledge and skills in religious studies. In addition to traditional applications, funding may be used (if approved) for conferences, seminars, camp, formals studies or other activities or events. The dove indicates our work for peace in our own lives and throughout the world, shown by the globe.

At the center of the design is the cross, though which our sins are forgiven and we are freed to live in Christ, who is at the center of our lives.

The overall design is that of a butterfly, the symbol of newness in Christ and the emergence of a new creation, Presbyterian Women.

I am truly humbled and honored to receive the Honorary Lifetime PW Membership Award. I attribute (blame) past recipient, Katie Beery, for persistently inviting me to become involved through PW Missions. It is a blessing to have the support and wisdom of so many truly faithful women. I am really looking forward to our next Horizon's Bible Study in September, "Let Justice Roll Down- God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation." Taking care of God's earth and people is in my DNA.

I was raised by hardworking, God loving, really, really, good people parents on a farm two miles north of the small town of Three Oaks. MI. Brought up in the Dutch First Reformed Church that my great grandfather served as a founding member and elder in the 1880s. He and his brothers farmed and planted 24 acres of concord grapevines. Over 200 vines remain today that my sister and I continue to tend. I graduated from the University of Michigan in 1973 with a dental hygiene degree. Being the consummate optimist, my advice is to "never give up, and always trust that the Lord has the perfect plan for your life, and it most usually is NEVER what you expected!"

I strive to live a life of faith, gratitude, and service, volunteering in some capacity since high school, including Washtenaw County Juvenile Detention Center in the 1970's, Big Brother/Big Sister and Oakland County Youth Assistance in the 80's, Fort Myer's church sponsored third grade reading program, and many more non-profits today through our First Presby Women's Mission programs. It really excites me that we can take part in long standing, effective national and international programs



through PW that exemplify loving of others as Christ taught us to love. I really dislike injustice, unkind, greedy, and disrespectful people and understand through my faith, that these are the exact ones who really need our love, to be seen and listened to for who they are, wherever they might be in their life's journey.

Sage advice I have received over the years: Overtip your servers, they really need it and appreciate it. Give somebody a ten, twenty or more and do not worry about whether they deserve it. Do not live in fear and worry about being safe, especially after doing everything you can to prevent harm. Trust in our Lord. God is with you all the time. In fact, try and not waste much energy worrying at all. Let life break your heart, and not just once. Love your neighbor, yourself, and God, with your whole being. Seek the truth, first hand. Never, ever judge anyone, listen and learn. Lighten up, include humor and gratitude every day of your life. Contribute the special talents God has given you and always find a way to laugh amid it all!
