



The Follow Me curriculum is based on practices Jesus did and taught us to do as faithful followers. Written for people of all ages who wish to live out their faith, this curriculum examines where these practices are found in the Bible and how they have been used in Christian faith then and now. These classes meet on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of

the month for grades 2-5, middle school, high school, and adults.


Our focus practice in November and December is Hope. Hope is waiting in faith. It is not merely wishing for something to happen or hoping everything will work out if the stars align. Hope is waiting with anticipation—at times, with impatience—for what you know and believe is coming. In Hebrew, the word for rope and hope are the same. Hope is something outside of ourselves that tethers us to safety and helps us keep going, even when we can't see our way.

Hope is visible if we pay attention

- Create a HOPE anagram with reminders of God's hope, decorate it, and display it.
- Observe and practice acts of kindness, exploring how they ripple to others.
- Plant seeds as symbols of hope and watch them grow.
- During Advent, look for signs of hope like wreaths, calendars, and banners in your surroundings.
 Reflect on how waiting ties to hope.
